Bio-Glass™, available in 110" x 49" slabs, is made from 100 percent recycled glass and is recyclable. White and light green glass slabs contain one hundred percent pre-consumer recycled content broken glass panes from the glass manufacturing industries that would ordinarily go towards landfills. Dark brown, green and blue are produced using one hundred percent post-consumer glass from beer, water and other bottles and jars.

Offered in both polished and natural finish, Bio-Glass™ makes an innovative and sustainable design statement. Bio-Glass™ has also earned the note-worthy NSF and GreenSpec third party certifications.
